

#### A few words from the Ambassador

This month got off to a great start with the worldwide celebrations of International Women's Day on 8 March. Doha hosted a number of events to celebrate the inspirational and powerful women that have made Qatar the successful country it is today, and we shared in these celebrations at the Brussels Embassy. Building on these celebrations, I was incredibly pleased to see the first Qatar Airways flight operated by a female-only crew depart from Brussels to Doha on Sunday 10 March.

In more airline-related news, I had the pleasure earlier this month to be present when the EU-Qatar Comprehensive Air Transport Agreement was initialed at the European Commission headquarters. The agreement is the first of its kind between the EU and a Gulf country. It received praise from across the EU for setting ambitious standards for not only fair competition and transparency, but also with regards to social and environmental matters.

Moreover, it is yet another example of the strong economic and

diplomatic relationships between the EU and Qatar, and the many opportunities that still lie ahead.

From 12 to 14 March, Qatar participated in the Brussels III

Conference on 'Supporting the future of Syria and the region', coorganised by the EU and the UN. His Excellency Deputy Prime

Minister and Minister of Foreign Affairs, Sheikh Mohammed bin

Abdulrahman Al Thani, reiterated Qatar's commitment to working

with international partners towards a peaceful resolution of the

Syria crisis, and announced our country's pledge of a further \$100

million to help alleviate the suffering of the Syrian people, who need
our support so desperately.

# The Peninsula Qatar – Qatar Airways flies all-female flight from Brussels to Doha

Qatar Airways' flight from the Belgian capital to Doha was operated by an entirely female crew, the first flight of its kind, reports **The Peninsula Qatar**. HE the Ambassador was invited to the European Commission to witness the signing of the Comprehensive Air Transport Agreement between Qatar and the EU. The agreement marks a historical step in the cooperation between the State of Qatar and the EU.

### HE the Foreign Minister meets with EU and UN officials in Brussels





Following his attendance at the Conference on 'Supporting the future of Syria and the region', HE Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Foreign Affairs, Sheikh Mohammed bin Abdulrahman Al Thani, met with EU High Representative for Foreign Affairs and Security Policy and Vice-President of the EU Commission, Federica Mogherini, to discuss developments in the region, as well as the strengthening of relations between Qatar and the EU. HE the Foreign Minister also met with NATO Secretary General Jens Stoltenberg to discuss Qatar-NATO cooperation on common issues including cyber defence, energy security, non-proliferation of weapons of mass destruction and crisis management.
